



The Swedish Education Act



"all children and young people shall, irrespective of gender, place of residence or their social or financial conditions, have **equal access to education** in the state school system for children and young people. Education in all types of schools shall be of equal value, irrespective of where in Sweden it is provided.

Education should provide pupils with knowledge and skills, and, in partnership with their homes, **promote their harmonious development** towards becoming responsible human beings and members of society. Consideration should also be afforded to pupils with **special needs**. Educational activity should be devised in accordance with fundamental democratic values.

Everyone working in schools should promote consideration for the intrinsic value of each human being and respect for our shared environment. Those working in schools must pay special attention towards promoting equality between the sexes and actively opposing all forms of abusive behaviour, such as bullying and racism."

The Upper Secondary School Curriculum



"The education should be carried out in accordance with fundamental democratic values and human rights, covering the inviolability of people, the freedom and integrity of the individual, the equal value of all people, gender equality and solidarity between people."

"School staff should inform and guide students prior to choosing courses, further education and professional orientation, and counteract restrictions on choices that are based on stereotyped views concerning gender and social or cultural background."

Vocational programs

Vocational program with 12 national programs has a vocational content. The vocational diploma can give access to higher education if the student chooses certain elective courses.

A program in upper secondary education may lead to an upper secondary diploma, enabling access to higher education. The higher education preparatory program with six national programs has a general education content.


